

Bartłomiej Kaminski is an Associate Professor of Government at the University of Maryland and a consultant on Europe Central Asia at the World Bank in Washington D.C. He is responsible for a series of background reports on foreign trade and foreign investments policies, institutions and performance prepared for the World Bank's Country Economic Memoranda on Albania, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Latvia, Romania, Slovakia and Turkey. He has also been a member of the Central European Economic Forum, the IMF/World Bank economic Policy Team for the Western Balkans and the Adam Smith Center in Warsaw among other affiliations.



He received his academic habilitation from the University of Warsaw in 1978 and has lectured at such institutions as Johns Hopkins University, University of Beijing, University of Maryland, University of Denver, Kent State University as well as University of Warsaw. He is the author or co-author of nine books and several chapters in edited volumes, journal articles, policy and research papers as well as technical reports.
